# Welcome Back

A warm welcome to the start of the Autumn Term 2017. I hope you all managed to have a good break over the summer. The children have started the term with enthusiasm (despite what they might say at home!) and there is as always lots to fit in to the curriculum before the half term break so we are already busy learning.

#### **Calendar of events**

#### Signing children in and out of school

From Monday 18<sup>th</sup> September, children can only be signed in or out using the touch screen in the front entrance. Select the 'pupils' box, the 'year group' and then 'class'. You will then be asked to select the day of your child's birthday and your child's name will show on the screen. Select your child's name and you will be given options to explain the reason for signing your child in. If you need to collect your child before the end of the school day, it is the same process for signing out.

#### **Unexpected fire alarm!**

The unexpected fire alarm practice on Wednesday was caused by someone pressing onto the red emergency fire alarm point without realising it. The school was evacuated promptly and very calmly. Our EYFS pupils in particular showed great resilience and coped extremely well with the situation on only their 3<sup>rd</sup> morning in school! I am going to look into the possibility of having the alarm point moved but please be aware it is there, especially during busy times in the front entrance.

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# <u>Staffing</u>

In addition to the new staff mentioned in my last Newsletter, we are pleased to welcome Mrs Kirsten Bilby to the staff as SENCo to cover Mrs Edward's maternity leave. All staff are their enthusiastic selves and are working hard to get to know your children and to settle them into their new year groups.

# **Playground**

When the morning whistle goes, we would ask that you stand back, away from the children's line so that the teachers can clearly see all of the children. If you need to speak urgently to a member of staff, please do but if a longer time is needed to communicate something, please make an appointment via the admin team. Please can parents let the year 2 classes go through the small gate by the side of KS1 first so that the children can keep together, before going through themselves.

#### **Driving Improvement**

Following our curriculum meetings, there are 4 key priorities we are working on this year that you can help with at home :-

1. To improve outcomes in reading by practising answering questions about a book and finding the answers in the book.

2. To improve outcomes in writing by writing down the answers to a question that has been talked about first

3. To improve outcomes in maths by asking the children to explain their thinking and how they found the answer. Can they find another way? How can they prove they are right?

4. To learn all of their times tables by the end of year 4.

We hope that the curriculum meetings, curriculum grids, learning reviews and the website will support you when you are helping your children with learning at home but please do not hesitate to ask if you have any questions.

# Free School Meals

We are so lucky to have such a brilliant team in our kitchen.

Do you know that you can apply for your child to have a cooked meal, free of charge when your child is in KS2? You can also apply for Free School Meals when your child begins Reception because although they receive a cooked meal free of charge under the Infant Free School Meals scheme, your family and school also benefit from extra funding to support learning including uniform, trips and residentials from the start of their reception year until year 6. Your child may be entitled to free school meals if you are in receipt of certain benefits, such as Income Support. Applications for free school meals can be made online, at

Please contact the school office in confidence for further assistance. You can claim your entitlement for Free School Meals, even if your child prefers a packed lunch.

The school receives additional financial support for each child who receives free school meals, and we are able to offer reduced costs for school trips, and also free packed lunches, to those children who are in receipt of free school meals.
