## Learning is exciting at Wheatfields Primary!

**Reception** This week we have been continuing with our topic of 'Dinosaurs'. We have been sponge painting dinosaur footprints, fossil hunting and in PE we were exploring different prehistoric movements to represent a variety of verbs. The pupils have been trying hard with their writing so they can share it with the KS1 pupils in the 'Wow Assembly'. The 'part, part, whole' method for addition has been introduced in maths which the children will be keen to practise at home. The pupils have been sharing their thoughts and ideas on what it means to be kind and how they can show empathy towards others. They all were reflective and came up with some very mature responses.

Year 1 We are Light house experts! Not only have we learnt a fictional story about Lighthouses, but now the children of Year 1 have learnt a story about a Light house that actually happened! Both classes have learnt new words that helped describe Grace's story and have also managed to sequence her story in chronological order! In maths, both sets of children have been consolidating their understanding of telling the time on an analogue clock and have also been introduced to a 24hr clock! This week the whole of Year 1 have been writing their own sections of their reports to show off to you how fantastic their writing is. Well done one and all!

**Year 2** Year 2 are very excited about the Year 2 Music Festival next Tuesday morning. We will be welcoming Year 2s from Thorndown, Eastfield, Holywell, Hemingford and St Helens so sing a selection of Beatles songs. The children have loved learning them and I'm sure you've heard them singing them around the house. We have learnt love me do, hard day's night, help, ticket to ride, she loves you, yellow submarine, let it be, all you need is love, can't buy me love and with a little help from my friends. It looks set to be a great morning.

Year 3 This week we have been on our school trip to St.Albans or Verulanium as the Romans called it. We had an amazing day. We began by visiting the amphitheatre.
