Alongside their transition, the children have been observing the transition of our class caterpillars. In the environment the children have been a buzz writing and problem solving throughout the week. In other news, this week the children have had the opportunity to experience their new classrooms and meet their new teachers in preparation for the next academic year. In Maths, we have been using balancing scales and non standard units to understand the concept of mass and weight. In Literacy, we have been writing the ingredients and instructions needed to make our favourite sandwich.

Year 2 This week in Year 2, we had a fantastic sports day. It was great to see all the children involved in so many different sporting activities. In English, we have been reading the text 'Meerkat Mail'. We have been discussing why Sunny the Meerkat wants to leave his home in the Kalahari Desert and thinking about why he should stay with his family. We have also been writing about how we feel if we go away from our families or stay somewhere new. In Maths, we have been telling and recording the time on clock faces and adding hours to the time. All the children seemed happy on 'Jump Up' day.

The children who stayed at school also had an amazing time and really enjoyed everything they did. The children have got stuck back into their learning, looking at reported and direct speech.
