

# EYFS BUSY CHOOSING ACTIVITIES

*Some of these activities are repeated as they can be revisited many times 😊*

Hide something around your house or garden and write clues to help someone find it.	Invent your own bug hotel using junk modelling. Leave outside for a while to see if you have any visitors.	Go on a nature treasure hunt – look for natural treasures in the garden. Maybe do an observational drawing to show us what you found.	Get reading!  Read words, labels, stories...read every day and as many things as you can!	Write an update in your nature diary! What has the weather been like? What nature have you spotted?	Practise your ball skills- can you throw, roll, push a ball to a partner? Use your numbers to count how many times you can catch it ion one go!	With a timer, sit for five minutes by the window or in the garden. Draw or write everything you see.	Use natural items such as sticks and stones to create a picture or collage. It could be a portrait of you or your favourite animal.
Play schools! Use resources you have at home to line up your teddies and pretend to be Mrs Baker or Miss Whittle!	Draw a picture and write a letter to a classmate.  <i>If you upload this to Tapestry we will tag your friend so they can see it!)</i>	Freeze some petals and flowers in water. Leave it on a plate/tray somewhere to melt and observe what happens over time.	Make your own invisible ink using lemon juice. Heat the paper with an iron and watch your message come to life!	Use the sunshine to create shadows outside.  Draw around your shadows using your chalk or place the objects on paper.	Find a selection of suitable objects. Make a prediction about whether they will float or sink. Put them in water to see if you were right!	Collect ten things and leave them in a line. Then collect other amounts and build teen numbers using the stem sentence 'I know it is 15 because it is a ten and a 5'	Build a den! Find things around your house or garden to construct your own den. Take a picture or draw a picture adding labels to tell us what you used.
