A Reading River


Reading Rivers **show the journey of the things you are reading**. Essentially, it is a personalised list, in the shape of a river's journey, with all the things you read marked along it. Here are some examples. Please send your Reading Rivers in to share with your class.

A comic strip story

Make comics and mini-books based on your topic work.



A supervillain



Give your supervillain a name, for example Trevor Vickers; International Story Stealer. Create crime scenes, newspaper articles and wanted posters for your supervillain. Write stories and choose wow words to defeat him or her.

Bedrooms reflect a person's personality. Design one for a character in a story that you have enjoyed. Think about the things in your own bedroom; did you choose the wallpaper, duvet cover, bed? What things do you have lying about - devices, clothes, homework or old toys? Is it tidy or messy?
