<p>Use a tape measure, ruler or create your own measuring stick with one you find in the garden to measure different plants around your garden or local park.</p>	<p>Draw around the shoes of everyone in your house. Can you use Lego blocks, cubes or perhaps counting items you have at home to measure each footprint. Compare who has the largest and shortest feet.</p> 		<p>Make your own magic shop to sell some of the giants items or your own treasures. Make tags for each items explaining how many magic beans each items costs. You could use your salt dough beans as money from people e in your family to buy items with.</p>	<p>Can you create your own giants castle, beanstalk, axe or perhaps a golden harp using junk modelling. You may decide instead of climbing the beanstalk you would like Jack o fly in a plane or create him his own jet pack. Be creative and enjoy creating your masterpiece.</p>	<p>Use you sound mat to create a wanted poster for your very own giant. Make sure when you draw your giant you think about their hair colour, eye colour and whether they have a great big bushy beard 😊</p>	<p>Use salt dough to make your own magic beans. Practise mixing colours in order to paint them ready to then play wit. You could design your own beanstalk, create magic spells that go with your beans or perhaps add them to your fairy garden.</p>

Maybe you could change the ending, add different treasures for Jack to steal or perhaps make Jack the baddie instead of the gaint.</p>	<p>Plant seeds in different conditions to see which grow the quickest. You could think of a place with lots of sun, a dark place, change the amount of water you give them or perhaps have some with soil and some in cotton wool.</p>	<p>In your mud kitchen or perhaps when cooking with someone at home, can you talk about capacity. Compare which ingredients you are using the most of?</p>	<p>Check the weather, and write or film yourself doing a report. Did we get the weather we had expected?</p>	<p>Can you create different types of prints using natural objects. You could halve fruit and veg or perhaps collect different types of leaves.</p>	<p>Cut out different 2D shapes and use them to create your own giant's castle.</p> 	<p>Add flower petals, leave or perhaps sequins to ice in order to make blocks. Use your ice blocks to create your own ice castle for the giant. How long does it last before it melts?</p>	<p>With a timer, sit for five minutes by the window or in the garden. Draw or write everything you see.</p>
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Write a letter to someone you love, It could be a family member, a friend you are missing, mummy, daddy or maybe it could be to your favourite book character.	Play BINGO or SPLAT in some way – tricky word bingo, teen number bingo/splat ... just make a grid, fill it in and off you go!	Find out more about members of your family. Can you write a question for someone to answer. Perhaps you want to find out what Grandma does for a job? What is Grandads favourite dinner? How old was your Auntie when she learnt to ride her bike?	Write a letter to the giant from Jack. Make sure he apologies for stealing and maybe he could invite the giant round for tea. What would you serve a giant?	Build a reading den! Find somewhere cosy and snuggle up with a few favourite books and teddies.	Play schools! Use resources you have at home to line up your teddies and pretend to be Mrs Baker or Miss Whittle!	Use Lego, construction bricks or some toys you have at home to create your own story image of Jack and the Beanstalk. You could use this to help you retell the story to someone at home.
