Safeguarding your children

Keeping your child safe is something you are doing all the time. There are no new dangers on the internet, only variations of old ones. You need to

- · Recognise what the issues are
- Judge the level of risk for your children
- Decide what you need to do to keep your child safe

Here are some things you may be able to do

Choose technology to keep your children safe.

The Local Authority preferred online environment for primary schoolchildren is STARZ. It is important that individual usernames and passwords are kept safe and secret (but shared with parents).

The Starz messaging system means that pupils can only communicate with

other pupils in the school community.

Encourage your children to use Starz at home and get them to show you what they are doing.
