The British Legion Appeal

Wheatfields Primary School is proud to support the British Legion Poppy Appeal. In assembly today, I talked to the children about being thankful and grateful for the work of our soldiers by donating some money and wearing a poppy with pride. Poppies and other items like wristbands can be purchased in school. There is a suggested donation of £1 for wristbands and reflectors and snap bands can be purchased with a suggested donation of £1.50. Snap bands cannot be worn in school and the children know why! There is no suggested donation amount for poppies. All items will be available from tomorrow (Tuesday 8 November).

Wheatfields Anti-bullying Week

Bullying is an issue that Wheatfields staff and pupils take very seriously throughout the year and anti-bullying week gives staff the opportunity to highlight the importance of speaking up when bullying happens or is witnessed.
