This newsletter will keep you updated with events at Wheatfields Primary and it is intended to add to the information you receive on a regular basis from your child's class teacher in the weekly 'Learning Review' and termly curriculum letters.

Headteacher thoughts – this term

The term started for the school team on 4th January 2020 in preparation for the return of pupils on the 5th January. Boris' announcement that schools would be closing to all but critical workers and vulnerable children on the evening of the 4th Jan meant that school closed on the 5th in order to re-open to critical workers and vulnerable children on the 6th. In addition, all of our plans were put in place for home learning and using google classroom for those pupils learning remotely. As I reflect on this, the way that the Wheatfields Community responded to this challenge was phenomenal. Parents offered incredible support to the school and in the end we had 87 out of 350 pupils attending school at some point lockdown. Thank you for your help in keeping our numbers in school as low as possible. Parents have also been very quick to communicate when their child is symptomatic and they are booking a test. Our track record in positive Covid tests amongst pupils and families remains low and there has been no positive cases this term in the staffing team. School staff have also got used to twice weekly LFD testing. I don't think the testing will ever get any easier!

97% of pupils engaged in remote learning. Those that weren't engaging were followed up by doorstep visits, phone calls and emails. Thank you parents for supporting your children so well during this period. It was important to recognise that every family circumstance is different and the school was able to respond well to any concerns that were raised with us.

The Wheatfields children have returned to school with enthusiasm and such a positive attitude to learning. On 8th March we had 100% attendance which doesn't happen very often! These 3 weeks have been spent settling back in, assessing the children to see where they are in their learning and to determine the focus of teaching for the summer term. There will be gaps in learning for every child across the country. Our job is to identify those gaps for Wheatfields pupils and focus on the teaching and learning that will give them the best possible transition into the next academic year in September 2021. It is also important to not just focus on maths and English and include the wider curriculum; something that Wheatfields does really well. Teaching teams have got together with colleagues in the year above and below to support this process. Our parent consultations this week have been our opportunity to share some of our findings with you. The Parent & Carer survey also gives us good information to support our work next term and beyond.

DfE Advice on Discretionary Payment for Isolation

On Monday, the DfE advised that parents and carers of children who have been advised to self-isolate by their education setting or by NHS Test and Trace are now able to apply for a [Test and Trace Support Payment](#) or discretionary payment of £500, if they meet the eligibility criteria. The extension of the Test and Trace Support Payment scheme, which is administered by district and unitary local authorities in England, ensures that parents receive the financial support they need if they are unable to attend work due to childcare responsibilities.
