Message from the Governing Body

You may be aware that Mrs Thornton is currently not in school due to ill health. We can now communicate that Mrs Thornton will be leaving Wheatfields at the end of this academic year. She has been a truly inspirational leader and she will be greatly missed. We are hoping that there will be opportunities for the children, staff and parents to say goodbye over the coming months. Happily, Mrs Verney-Davies, has agreed to take up the position of Interim Headteacher and Mrs Edwards as Interim Deputy until August 2024. We are delighted that Mrs Verney-Davies and Mrs Edwards will be in post for this period, offering stability and assurance to all parents, pupils and staff. The children have been informed during assembly this morning. Governors are secure that the school is in extremely safe hands and we offer both our congratulations.

Mental Health at Wheatfields

We are looking forward to welcoming parents/carers to our summer Stay and Connect sessions in June. The sessions aim to help children and adults understand the importance of making connections with each other and the support it offers to our mental health and well-being. The sessions will take place outside (weather permitting) and will involve a variety of activities such as giant noughts and crosses, paper airplane making, conversations starters and much more.

Supervision before School

Some children are arriving to school especially early in the mornings, and are using the playground space or the areas just outside the school gates to congregate or organise games before the start of the day. Doors open between 8:40-8:45am and children should not be on site much before this time. They are not to play football or use the outdoor climbing equipment as there is no staff supervision during this time. We also expect children to demonstrate good behaviours in areas directly outside the school gates with consideration for our neighbours and pedestrians. We have reminded the children of this expectation in school, but would appreciate your support in reiterating this at home.
