Learning is exciting at Wheatfields Primary,

Reception EYFS have had a busy start to the Summer term focusing on the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar. The pupils helped Mrs Guest read the story and were all confident to order and discuss the story. We have also been thinking about healthy living and eating and discussing which foods we should be eating more of and those we need to eat in moderation. It was lovely to listen to each of the pupils share their holiday news and develop their listening and questioning skills. Year 2 What a great first week back full of sunshine it's been! The children have begun exploring materials in Science this week linking their understanding to our topic of traditional tales. We also have been look back through our understanding and application of both addition and subtraction. The children have been applying their knowledge to solve missing number problems and reasoning rhymes. Within Literacy the children have been looking at the features of a newspaper article and how we can capture the readers attention through well chosen language such as exciting adjectives. Alongside all of this exciting learning the children have also been exploring the royal family through our history lesson. They will be building up their knowledge of the royal family members ready to celebrate the upcoming royal wedding later in the year. So, using the cross-curricular links, in Literacy this week, we have started the Non-fiction genre of 'Biographies', to help us write a biography of 'Howard Carter'.
