Make an Easter card for someone special to you. Remember to use your sounds to write out your message.



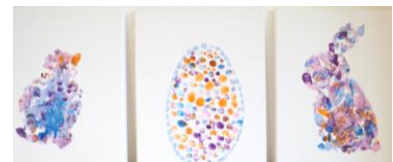

Think about the things that make Easter special to you and your family. Draw an outline and use your finger tips to create a finger print painting. Remember to label and sign it.



Salt Dough Recipe

Makes: 1 ball

Prep: 10 minutes

Cook: 3 hours

- 1 cupful of plain flour (about 250g)
- half a cupful of table salt (about 125g)
- half a cupful of water (about 125ml)

Method

1. Preheat the oven to its lowest setting and line a baking sheet with baking parchment.
2. Mix the flour and salt in a large bowl. Add the water and stir until it comes together into a ball.
3. Transfer the dough to a floured work surface and shape into your chosen design. You can roll it out and cut out shapes, numbers or letters using biscuit cutters, or make any kind of model you can think of. We made some eggs, bunnies and carrots for Easter decorations.
4. Put your finished items on the lined baking sheet and bake for 3 hrs or until solid.
5. Leave to cool and then paint.
