## Learning is exciting at Wheatfields Primary!

**Reception** In EYFS this week we have been talking about managing changes in preparation for transition and we thought of questions we could ask our new teachers. We had a wonderful jump-up morning getting to know our new teachers and the children in our classes. We are all very excited for September! In Maths, we represented the numbers 19 and 20 in a variety of ways. It was our final forest fun session this week. We toasted our marshmallows on the campfire and had a brilliant time! Year 1 Year 1 have had another super week as we look forward to the summer holiday. In maths we have been counting in 2s, we have watched lots of funny videos, hung up some socks and found missing numbers in a pattern. In English we have listen to the poems from Commotion in the Ocean, we really enjoyed the colourful pictures and looking for rhyming words. In Science, we invented our own animal by putting different animal parts together, we thought about where they would live and which food group they would go into. In Geography we looked at aerial view photographs to see what we could learn from them, we also used google earth to look at a birds eye view of St Ives. We had a brilliant morning getting to meet our new teacher and spending time with our new class in our new classrooms. The children and staff are excited about September. On Friday we had our D&T morning which was a great success, the children really enjoyed making their animal rescue vehicle and enjoyed the challenge of attaching their axels and wheel and testing them on the ramps.

Year 2 We have had an amazing week in school this week! Year 2 walked from school to the Norris Museum and were guided round town to see all the significant and historical sites in St Ives. **Music** The Word of the Week is Compound Time Signature. This is when the beat can be subdivided into groups of 3.
