This newsletter will keep you updated with events at Wheatfields Primary and it is intended to add to the information you receive on a regular basis from your child's class teacher in the weekly 'Learning Review' and termly curriculum letters.

An improvement to the start of the day for KS2 pupils

On a rainy day, the children come straight into their classrooms. There is always a calmer and more purposeful start to the day on these days, even though it is raining! This would seem to be because there are fewer pupils trying to get somewhere at the same time and less distractions that could mean the day doesn't start as well as it could. There is more space in the KS2 cloakrooms and the children are expected to make their way calmly to their classrooms to begin their learning.

Therefore we would like to try this way of coming into school every day for pupils in KS2 (year 3 to year 5). Arrangements for EYFS, KS1 and year 6 pupils will remain the same as they are currently.

Years 3-5 will go straight into classrooms when they arrive on site between 8:30-8:40am, rather than line up on the playground. For all classes, except Class 7, entry will be via the external doors leading into the classrooms. For Class 7, pupils will enter via Class 8's door. Members of staff will be in classrooms to greet the children therefore there will not be members of staff on duty in the KS2 playground.

Registration will still be between 8:40-08:55am and all external classroom doors will close promptly at 8:40am. External doors will remain closed therefore any late-comers will be expected to sign in at reception. As before, any brief messages can still be left with class teachers at the door until 8:40am, or alternatively a note sent through with the child or via the school office by phone or email.

This change will take effect from Monday 10th February.






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Reading Well for Children - available from Cambridgeshire Libraries now



This month sees the launch of **Reading Well for children** collections in the <u>Cambridgeshire Libraries</u>, coinciding with Children's Mental Health Week.

The aim of Reading Well for Children is to support the mental health and wellbeing of Key Stage 2 children (aged 7-11), providing them, their families and carers with information, advice and support for coping with feelings and worries.

The booklist contains 33 titles covering topics relevant to the children of today, such as grief, anxiety, bullying and staying safe online, as well as about living with diagnosed conditions and physical disabilities.

These books include picture books, stories and nonfictions, and have been selected to encourage conversation about feelings between children and their parents or carers.

You can find the books in your local library for any library customer to borrow from 3rd February.


